Travel Guidelines

As part of the easing of COVID-19 restrictions, the Government of Canada has announced a series of adjustments to the current border measures and requirements for international travel.

As of February 28, 2022, the following changes will take place:

Children under 12 years old, travelling with fully vaccinated adults, will continue to be exempt from quarantine. They are no longer required to wait 14 days before attending school or child care.

All unvaccinated travellers (including children under 12 travelling with unvaccinated adults) will continue to be required to follow federal requirements for testing and quarantining, including not attending school or child care for 14 days.

Changes have also been made to the pre-entry testing requirements. Visit the federal travel website prior to booking any travel arrangements: COVID-19 vaccinated travellers entering Canada - Travel restrictions in Canada.

✓ Please remember:


- Schools normally stay open even when buses are cancelled.
- If buses are cancelled in the morning, they won't run in the afternoon either.
- If your child rides a school bus and it is cancelled, you don't need to call the school to report the absence.
- If your child does not ride a school bus, you still need to call the school if he or she is absent, even on an inclement weather day.
- Please don't call the school to check on buses, as it ties up phone lines needed for possible emergency calls.

Over the past couple of days many of our administrators have reached out to share the excellent work that staff are engaging in to support students during times of high stress at this time, and in the context of current global conflict. We can expect that for our staff and students, there will be many responses to the current conflict in the world, and that many of our students will be coming to school with heavier backpacks than usual.

When a frightening or traumatic event happens, children and youth may experience and exhibit a range of emotion. In the coming days, there are a number of things that we can do to provide support within our school communities.

The following tips may be helpful for educators and parents in the coming days and weeks:

- Do your best to take care of yourself and to maintain your calm. Your students are counting on the adults around them to guide and help them with their reactions.
- Maintain normal routines as much as possible; this helps students to feel secure and to view the world as more predictable.
- Limit the amount of media coverage of current events. Watching these events continually replayed can be overwhelming, especially for children or youth that are prone to worrying.
- Take time for yourself to process your own emotions and concerns. Talk with family, friends and colleagues, and engage in activities that provide you with comfort and a sense of predictability and security.

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
